Our mission is to help homeschooling families through prayer, support, encouragement, instruction, and accountability so that in their obedience they may be “steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord” (1 Cor 15:58). This Co-Op exists to help families committed to homeschooling by providing in-person high school level courses. This is a cooperative effort that requires parental support and involvement. Because each family is in a different stage of life, each family will contribute according to their ability in Co-Op. For some parents may help by teaching a class or being a helper in a classroom. Other parents may be hall/study hall monitors. Some parents may choose to be on a rotation to fill a spot for helping in a classroom monthly.

### Co-Op Responsibilities

- Honor Christ in the classroom and actively mentor students and parents participating.
- Follow all the training for working with students required by Community Bible Church. Two-Adult rule will be followed; therefore, we must have two adults present during classes.
- Prepare students through rigorous course work for the possibility of college or vocational school.
- Volunteer teachers will present material, incorporating discussion and written work to help students learn how to study, prepare presentations, listen to other points of view, defend arguments, and do challenging work.
- Assign work for students to complete at home and provide assessments through written assignments and tests. We will provide a classroom experience as well as grades and feedback for both parents and students.

### Parent Responsibilities

- Attendance and transportation. Students should be at Co-Op on time and should not miss class except for emergency or sickness. They will be required to turn in work in advance or make up any work that they miss.
- When registering must commit to signing waivers acknowledging that participation in this Co-Op is completely voluntary and students and families can be dismissed for any reason as well as religious convictions statements.
- Parents should teach students to take responsibility for their own work and come prepared to class.
- Commit to sign up to teach a class, help in a classroom or rotate helping in a classroom monthly.
- Provide assigned curriculum. We will try to have as many textbooks as we can to lend in Math & Science Classes.
- There is a \$50 Co-Op teacher supply fee per family for the year. Math students have additional My Math Assistant fee per student per year (should be \$25). Art has \$50 supply fee per semester.

Online registration will begin February 26<sup>th</sup> for the 2023-2024 School year.

We are still in need of instructors for **Chemistry, World History, American Literature, High School Grammar & Writing, Remedial Math Help** and either **Saxon 87** or **Saxon ½ Class**.

### Curriculum list

*Whenever possible to help all of our families we will use books that can be borrowed for the year and returned.*

- **7<sup>th</sup> Grade:** Notgrass America the Beautiful, Apologia General Science, Saxon 8/7, Well Ordered Language 3, Art of Argument, Lost Tools of Writing.
- **Math classes** will use Saxon textbooks.
- **Science classes** will use Apologia curriculum and some will require Apologia notebooks.
- **Government/Economics** will use BJU Government and Economics books as a spine but will have no required books to purchase.
- **British Literature** will have a book list, but no required books to purchase.
- **American Literature** is curriculum TBD.
- **World History** is curriculum TBD.
- **Grammar/Writing Class** is curriculum TBD.
